

#### **Tribute to the 100 Year Project Team**

In the Spring of 2012 I came across a copy of Palm Spring's 100 Year book published by the Hi-Desert Publishing Company. Its compelling contents encouraged me to read it cover-to-cover before I could put it down. I attributed my fascination to the fact that I was only vaguely familiar with a subject that was of high interest - the history of Palm Springs.

I then supposed that a similar history of Morongo Basin would hold the same interest for Basin residents. Sure, both Historical Societies had file drawers loaded with specifics about the Morongo Basin history. But an abbreviated compilation like Palm Spring's book didn't exist. A similar book about "us" could be of interest to

casual students of local history and serve as a primer for others. As with the Palm Springs book, each page would contain an essay about a single major local event in a given year along with a number of one-liners representing other events that took place both locally and around the world.

I met with Laurie Geeson and Bob Connors in late June to explore the possibility of taking on a similar project for the Morongo Basin. If we could get Hi-Desert Publishing to participate with its printing, binding and distribution processes, the project would become doable. We would take on the editorial part of the project that would span the years 1910 to and thru 2010.

A meeting with H-DP's Cindy Melland a few days later resulted in her enthusiastic agreement to participate.

Because there had always been an interest in sharing a project with the Twentynine Palms Historical Society, a presentation to their Board of Directors a month later resulted in their becoming the third party in what would become the 100 Year Project.

The first order of business was to

identify the 101 events that would be featured in the publication. That took much searching of local newspapers, magazines and photo archives together with exploring the works of local historians by volunteers from both organizations.

It was a daunting task, taking months and resulting in 22 pages of single spaced one-line event descriptors in 9.5 point type from which the 101 subjects were to be selected. The internet was used as reference for major events that took place around the world.

It was many additional months of work by enthusiastic authors of the 101 essays and Community Liaisons who recruited a number of individuals each of who was given the opportunity of donating \$100 for the privilege of sponsoring a year/page of their choice.


The 22-page list was perused by the Core Committee. MBHS chose 50 year/page subjects to work with and 29PHS, 51. In late July of 2014, all photos and copy from both organizations was turned over to Hi-Desert Publishing. They then began the task of composing the pages, sizing and cropping the photos, designing the covers, printing and binding the publication in preparation for distribution. When done, H-DP delivered copies of the book to each of its direct-delivery subscribers; left copies at its standard pick-up

direct-delivery subscribers; left copies at its standard pick-up locations and provided each of the historical societies with 600+ copies that could be used as extended fund raisers. Here at the Morongo Basin Historical Society, they're available for \$8.00 per copy. The price to members is \$5.00 each.

In addition to getting numerous word-of-mouth accolades, a professor of local history at CMC has expressed interest in using the book in some of his classes.

Taking into account both Historical Society's revenues from sponsorships and from the sale of some 1200+ books together with Hi-Desert Publishing Company's earnings from the sale of advertising space - and from the Project's cultural contribution to the Morongo Basin - one Core Committee member was prompted to observe that, "There's something in this for everyone." Indeed!


